



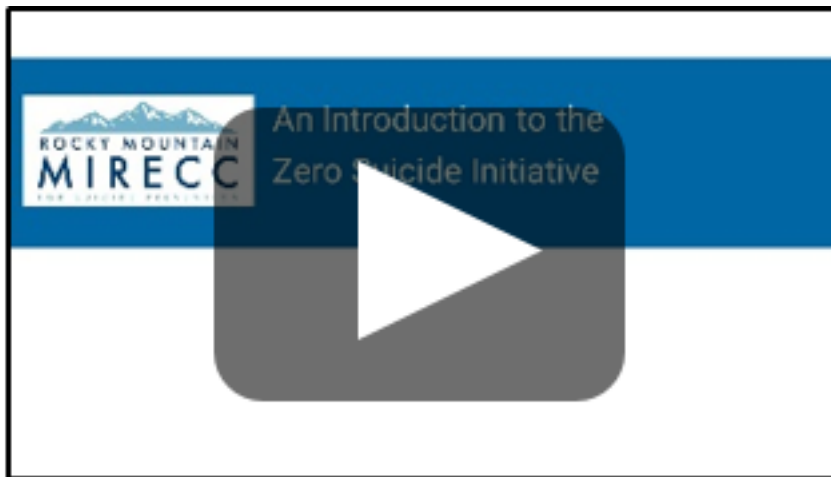
## Rocky Mountain Short Takes on Suicide Prevention
