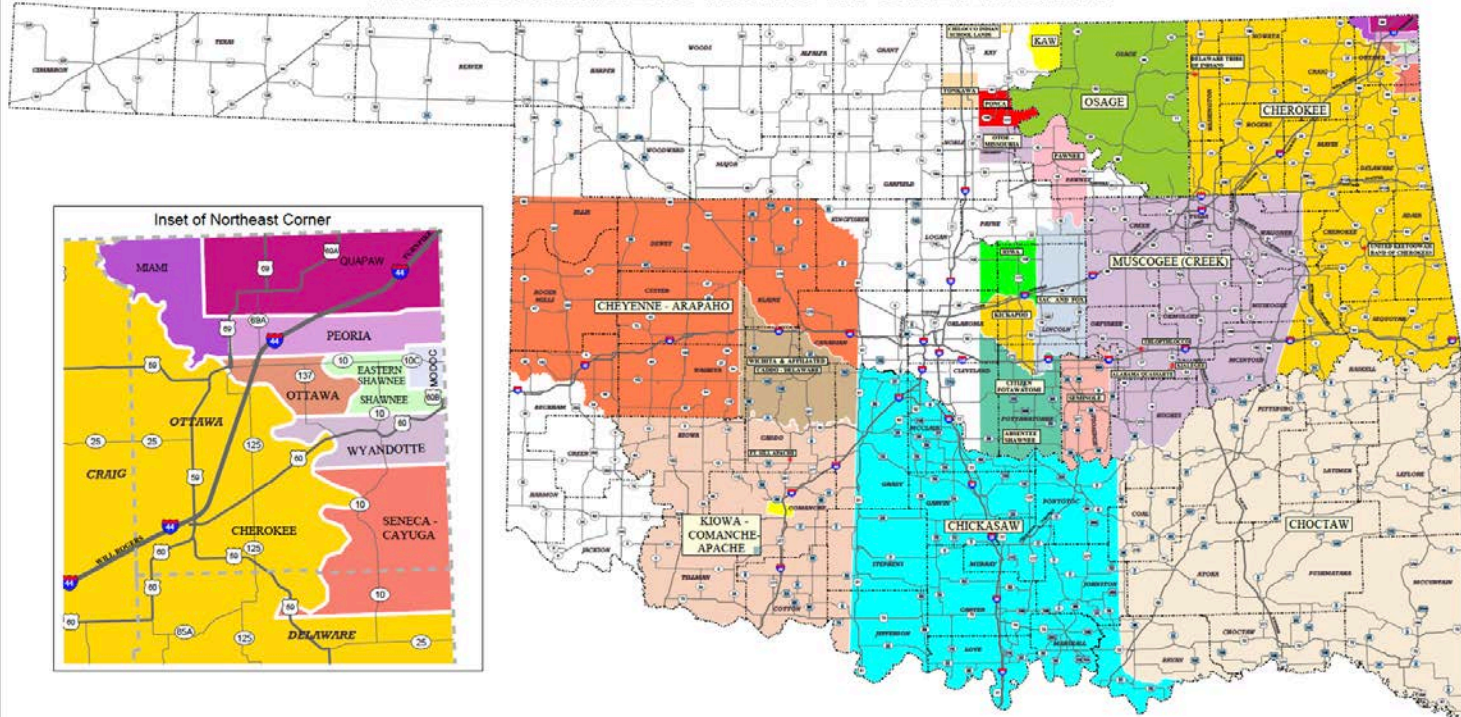

# TRIBAL JURISDICTIONS IN OKLAHOMA

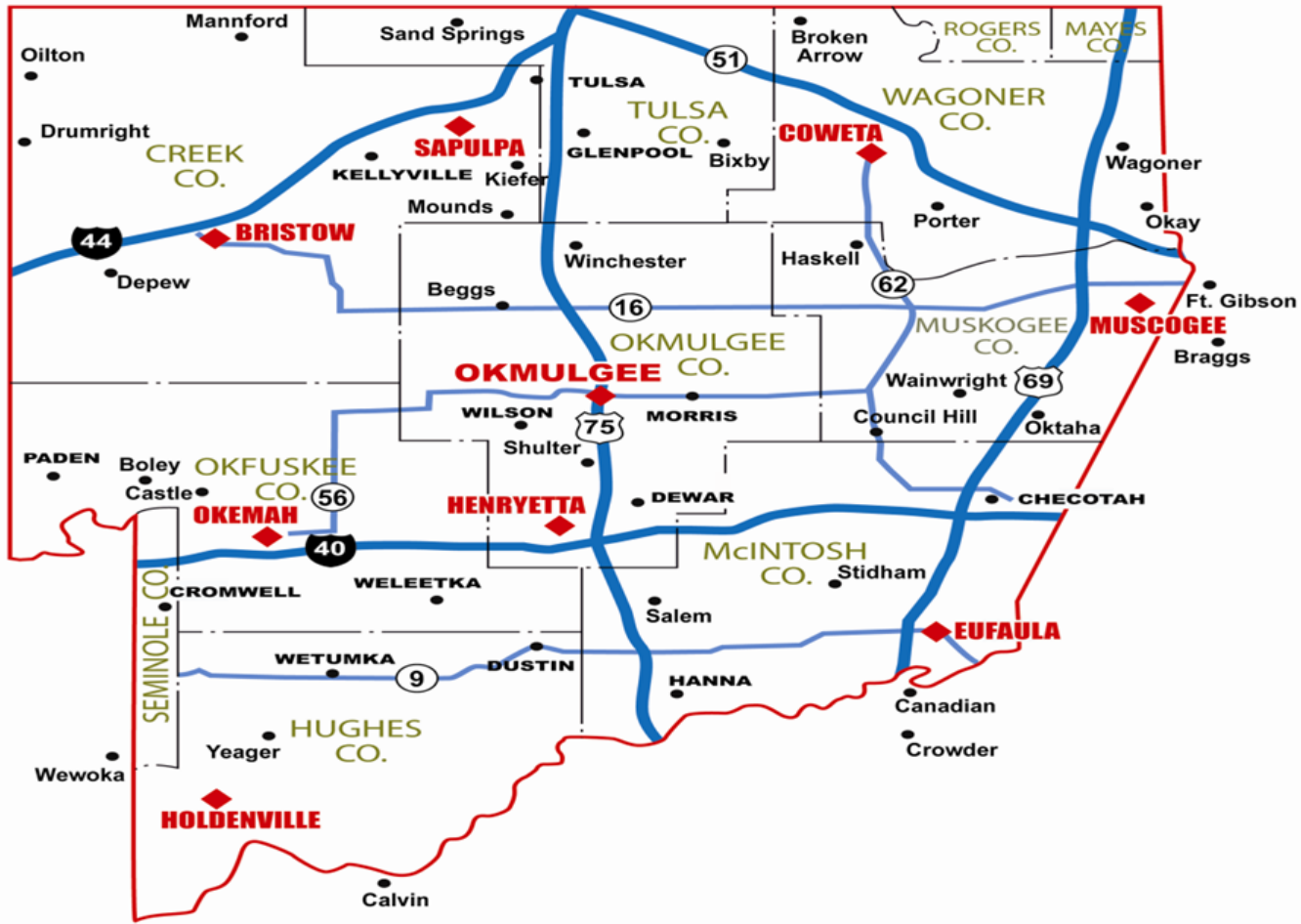

- Focus on prevention and early intervention
- Encouraged community and school based services
- Encouraged future grant considerations
- Encouraged system change

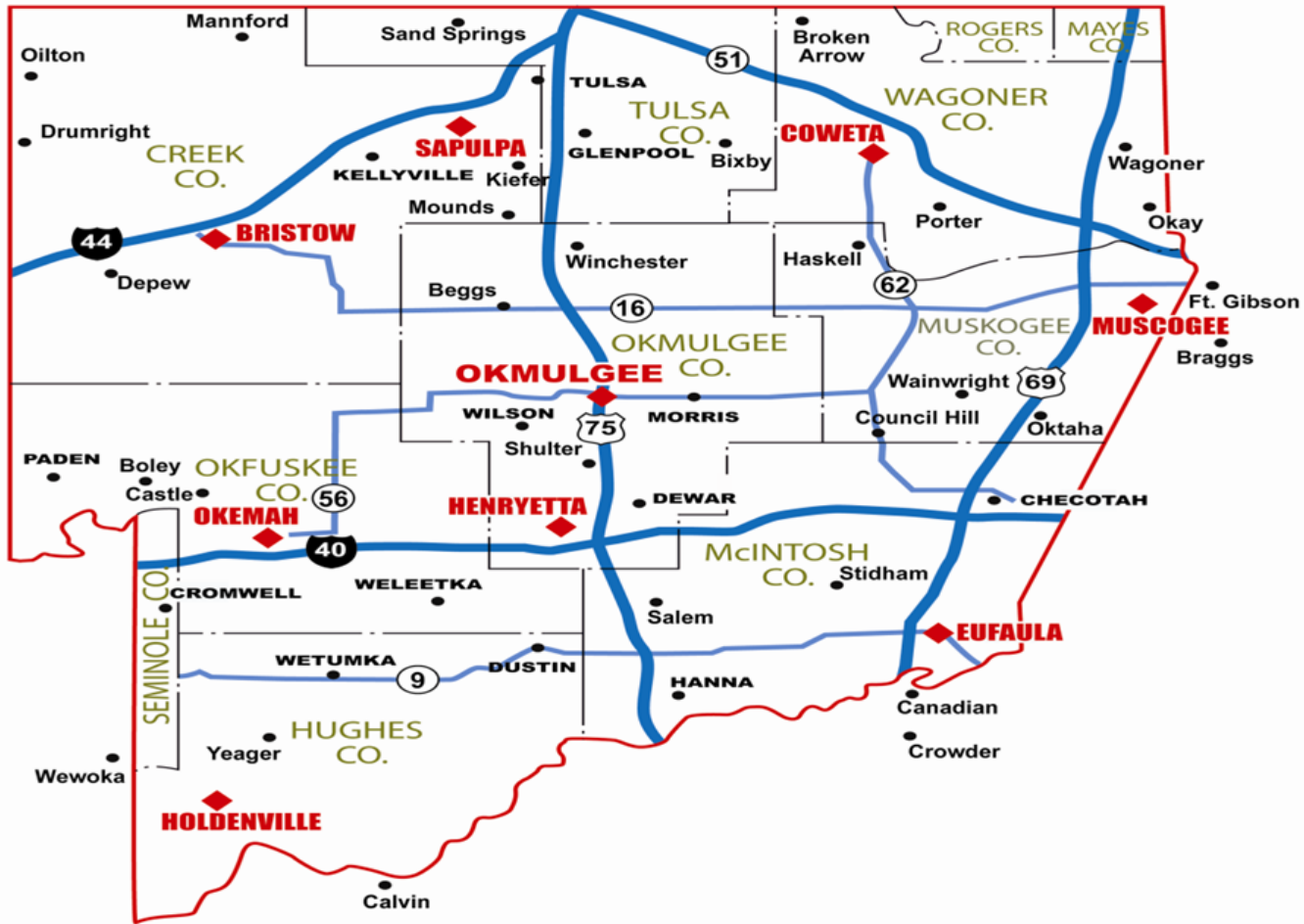
